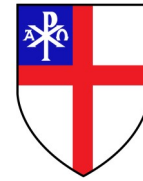

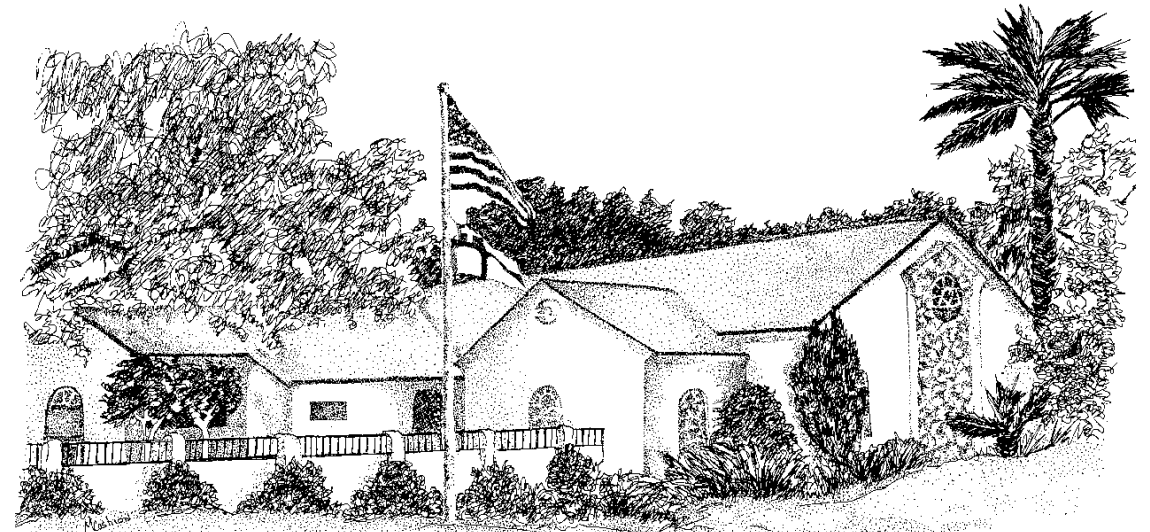

First Sunday in Lent

Genesis 9:8-17

After the waters of the flood had subsided, God said to Noah and to his sons with him, "Behold, I establish my covenant with you and your offspring after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the livestock, and every beast of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark; it is for every beast of the earth. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of the flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." And God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh. And the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, in which he went and proclaimed to the spirits in prison, because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him.

And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens opening and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. HOPE Helps: A Few Highlights from 2017—On January 10, HOPE turned 10 and opened their Resource Center and Food Pantry (Katie's Kupboard) for their clients. The newly renovated space, made possible through a Capital Campaign, allows them to serve clients with dignity in an atmosphere where they feel welcome. In 2017, HOPE touched the lives of 3,019 individuals through their Resource Center, Food Pantry, and Education Center, as well as served 557 children through their Kids of HOPE program. 11% of their clients are elderly/disabled and they have also seen an increase in single family households, at almost 40%. HOPE was honored to be recognized by the community as the "Best Non-Profit 2017" through the Ovations Awards-Oviedo Winter Springs Regional Chamber of Commerce. 15 new members joined the Hearts for HOPE Club in 2017, donating \$1,000+ a year to ensure HOPE's programs and operations. **If you would like to learn more about HOPE, they will have a tour of their facility on Wed.
